What are conjunctions?

Conjunctions are words and phrases that connect words, phrases, and clauses.

What are correlative conjunctions?

- Correlative conjunctions are conjunctions that work in pairs to join words, phrases, or clauses that hold an equal value or correlate with one another.
- When one thinks of correlative conjunctions, remember the “co” part of the word: this indicates that the conjunctions are a pair.

Correlative Conjunction Pairs	
Pair 1	both/and
Pair 2	either/or
Pair 3	neither/nor
Pair 4	not only//but also

both/and

This correlative conjunction pair is used to join two equal items together. You put one item after “both” and the second after “and” when using these conjunctions.

Example: We went to both the party and the after-party.

either/or

The correlative conjunction “either...or” is used to join two positive options. One option appears after the “either” and the second option appears after the “or.”

Example: The sound was either the multiverse expanding into various branches or my platypus performing a seance.

neither/nor

While “either...or” pairs up two positive options, “neither...nor” pairs up two negative options.

Example: The amusement park was neither exciting nor cheap.

not only/but also

This correlative conjunction pair is similar to “both...and” and emphasizes that two items belong in a pair.

Example: Her pet llama is not only violent, but it is also petty.

Note: As seen in the example, “not only” stays together as a unit; however, the “but also” can be split apart in the sentence.

Other correlative conjunction pairs

Keep in mind that there are various correlative conjunctions.

- Whether/or
- As/as
- not/but
- hardly/when
- No sooner/than

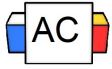
