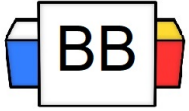


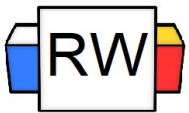

Interrogative Sentence

As defined, interrogative is an adjective that means, "having or conveying the force of a question."

An interrogative sentence asks a question.

- This type of sentence often begins with who, what, where, when, why, how, or do
- It ends in a question mark.

Example 1: How many times do I have to tell you to put your jester hat away?

Example 2: Did the cat win the fencing match?

Example 3: Did you ever have a huge rival?

Fun Note: Some writers will use both a question mark and exclamation point for an exclamatory question, but only the exclamation point is truly necessary.

Example 4: Why won't you leave me alone?

Example 5: Why won't you leave me alone!

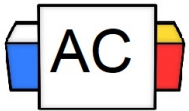

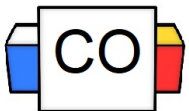
